# 2. Certificate and TSA type, validation procedures and usage

- 2.1. TSP issues three types of certificates
  - 2.1.1. Qualified electronic signatures certificates;
  - 2.1.2. Qualified electronic seal certificates;
  - 2.1.3. Certificates for client authentication.
- 2.2. All certificates SHALL be issued from LV eID ICA 2017 and eParaksts ICA 2017
- 2.3. Relevant Trust Services and Policies
  - 2.3.1. This PDS is associated with such Trust Services policies as follows:

- 2.4. TSP acts in conformance with [eIDAS regulation], [ETSI EN 319 411-1] and [ETSI EN 319 411-2] issuing certificates under policies:
  - 2.4.1. QCP-n-qscd
  - 2.4.2. QCP-n;
  - 2.4.3. QCP-I-qscd;
  - 2.4.4. QCP-I;
  - 2.4.5. NCP.
- 2.5. TSP also acts as Time stamping authority providing qualified time stamps. Time stamping authority acts in conformance with [ETSI EN 319 421]. Time stamping service meets the requirements of [ETSI EN 319 422] and [IETF RFC 3161].
- 2.6. Identity proofing and verification of natural person is based on Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2015/1502 of 8 September 2015, on setting out

minimum technical specifications and procedures for assurance levels for electronic identification means pursuant to Article 8(3) of Regulation (EU) No 910/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council on electronic identification and trust services for electronic transactions in the internal market.

- 2.7. Qualified certificates issued by TSP may be used only in accordance with [eIDAS regulation].

## 3. Reliance limits

## 6. Certificate status checking obligation of relying parties

- 6.1. Obligations are exposed in:
  - 6.1.1. General terms and conditions;
  - 6.1.2. Subscriber agreement;
  - 6.1.3. the relevant trust service policy;
  - 6.1.4. [CPS].

### 7. Limited warranty and disclaimer of liability

- 7.1. TSP undertakes to fulfill all of the obligations as defined both by laws and regulations effective in the Republic of Latvia, and by relevant trust service policies and [CPS];
- 7.2. TSP shall provide the above guarantees for the duration of the agreement on the provision of trusted services; if a breach of obligations on the part of the subscriber or the relying party having a connection with the alleged damage is determined, the warranty claims shall not be provided this must be reported to the subscriber or to the relying party and recorded;
- 7.3. TSP other possible damages based on the provisions of relevant laws, and their amounts, may be decided upon by the court.

### 8. Applicable agreements, policies and CPS

### 9. Privacy policy

- 9.1. The TSP shall safeguard the privacy of Subject information in according with laws and regulations effective in the Republic of Latvia. TSP will also ensure that all relevant information concerning a Certificate is recorded for an appropriate period of time, in particular for the purpose of providing evidence of certification for the purposes of legal proceedings.
- 10. Refund policy

10.1. If a subscriber or a relying party is not satisfied with the services, they may request certificate revocation and fee refund only if TSP does not fulfil its obligations and duties specified in the subscriber agreement, general terms and conditions, relevant trust service policy or [CPS].

#### 11. Applicable law, complaints and dispute resolution

- 11.1. The activities of TSP is in accordance with laws and regulations effective in the Republic of Latvia, relevant trust service policies and [CPS].
- 11.2. Should any dispute occur, arising or related to these procedures or related contracts, prior to initiating court proceedings the parties involved in the dispute shall try to settle the dispute or different opinions in good faith by negotiations between the parties.
- 11.3. Should the parties fail to settle the dispute through negotiations within a time period of one (1) month from the occurrence of the dispute, the parties shall agree to turn to the court of general jurisdiction, in accordance with the laws and regulations. Disputes shall not be settled by arbitration court.
- 11.4. Unless the parties or regulatory enactments provide otherwise, all disputes shall be settled by Riga City Vidzeme Suburb Court (the first instance).

## 12. TSP and Repository Licenses, Trust Marks and Audit

- 12.1. Accredited conformity assessment body perform the conformity assessment of TSP and Trust services provided by it in accordance with the laws and regulations effective in the Republic of Latvia.
- 12.2. Conformity assessment report are submitted to the supervisory body in order to ensure continuous status of Trust services in the Latvian Trust List.
